Subject: Transport for NSW (TfNSW) Funded Project Status (All)

The State Government provides regular funding opportunities under a number of Transport for NSW (TfNSW) programs for road safety and active transport (walking and bike riding) improvements. Randwick City Council was successful in securing funding for a number of projects. The total of TfNSW funds secured by Randwick Council, and indicated in the following table, exceeds \$19M.

Additionally, Federal Government funding has also been made available under the federal Black Spot Program. Apart from the Anzac Paths Project (APP), all listed projects are 100% externally funded (APP is funded on a 50/50 basis). The following table shows the status of currently approved projects.

Subject: Canberra Lane, Randwick - Installation of No Stopping Zone (C)

Background

Council received a request from the community to review the parking conditions at the intersection of Canberra Lane and Helena Street due to concerns regarding restricted sightlines and vehicles parking too close to the intersection.

Notification


Council officers inspected the site and confirmed that vehicles parked within 10 metres of the intersection restrict sight distance for drivers entering or exiting the intersection.

To address these concerns, council will be introducing the following parking controls:

- Western side: Install 30 metres No Stopping zone to maintain adequate sightlines and ensure vehicles can safely access and egress 24 Canberra Street, Randwick. The proposed extension also allows sufficient carriageway width for two-way vehicle movements along Canberra Lane.
- **Eastern side:** Install 12.8 metres *No Stopping* zone to prevent vehicles from obstructing driveway access and improve visibility for motorists.

These amendments will improve safety for all road users and maintain efficient traffic flow within Canberra Lane.

Subject: Jersey Road, Matraville - Installation 'No Parking' During

Peak Hours (M)

Background

Council has received concerns from residents regarding vehicle speeding and restricted traffic flow along the subject road. In response, a traffic count was undertaken, with data presented to the August Traffic Committee for review.

Site investigations conducted by Council officers confirmed that the narrow carriageway width restricts the movement of two-way traffic when vehicles are parked on both sides of the road, causing congestion and conflicts between opposing traffic movements.


Notification

To improve traffic flow and allow safe two-way vehicle passage, council will install the following parking controls:

- Extension of the existing No Stopping zone by 6.3 metres westward, ensuring sufficient clearance for vehicles to pass simultaneously.
- Installation of a 40-metre 'No Parking; 7AM–9AM; 3PM–6PM; Mon–Fri' zone to improve peak-hour traffic flow, as identified in the traffic count data.

These measures aim to enhance vehicle accessibility, reduce congestion during peak times, and improve overall road safety for motorists.
